Richard "Kalby" C. Kalbus Sr. age 84, of Butte des Morts, died Monday, December 6, 2021, at Ascension Mercy Hospital in Oshkosh. He enjoyed playing sheepshead and cribbage, bowling at T & O Lanes, gardening, and sitting under the tree looking at the lake and the busy Butte des Morts roads.
